We learn to constructively critique artwork, both that of famous artists and fellow classmates. We learn about and appreciate multicultural artwork and artists and how they bring richness and joy to our lives. We collaborate with members of our own class and school to create artwork together and value everyone's contributions.

#### **Our Intent**

The main aim of our Art and Design curriculum to develop children who are confident to take risks and experiment with their art work. The children at Little Bollington will gradually build on and develop secure artist skills to enable them to work with freedom and creativity. Our curriculum journey designed to give pupils every opportunity to develop their ability, nurture their talent and interests, express their ideas and thoughts about the world, as well as learning about art and artists across cultures and through history. Our scheme supports pupils to meet the National curriculum end of key stage attainment targets and has been written to fully cover the National Society for Education in Art and Design's progression competencies.

#### **Our Children**

Our Children are bring a lot of enthusiasm to their Art and Design learning. They feel happy to experiment with their own creative ideas and are willing to 'have a go'! The child approach their art learning with varying attitudes- from those who have a very precise vison of how they want their artwork to look and those who work with flair and an experimental style. We aim to foster both of these attributes to create art that is unique while skilfully executed. The children show pride in their work and are always keen to celebrate their achievements with others. Our children have a very limited experience of the arts and cultural capital so we must ensure we expose them to as much as possible and develop their curiosity and desired to find out more. We aim to celebrate the arts to ensure that they develop a love of engaging with and producing artwork.

#### **Our Implementation**

We follow the Kapow Scheme of work which complements the DT scheme. Art and DT are taught in rotation on a half termly basis. Units of lessons are sequential, allowing children to build their skills and knowledge, applying them to a range of outcomes. The formal elements, a key part of the National Curriculum, are also woven throughout units. Key skills are revisited again and again with increasing complexity in a spiral curriculum model. This allows pupils to revise and build on their previous learning. Units in each year group are organised into four core areas:



Our units cover each of the National curriculum attainment targets as well as each of the strands. The progression of knowledge and skills shows the skills that are taught within each year group and how these skills develop to ensure that attainment targets are securely met by the end of each key stage. The units fully scaffold and support essential and age appropriate, sequenced learning and where appropriate links are made to other curriculum areas. Creativity and independent outcomes are robustly embedded, supporting students in learning how to make their own creative choices and decisions, so that their art outcomes, whilst still being knowledge-rich, are unique to the pupil and personal. Lessons are always practical in nature and encourage experimental and exploratory learning. Our children come to lessons with varying levels of skills so we ensure that the initial lesson allows for assessment of prior learning to inform future planning. We ensure that lessons can be accessed and enjoyed by all pupils and opportunities to stretch pupils' learning are available when required. Kapow Primary supports teachers who may lack confidence in their own artistic abilities. Pupil videos created by subject specialists help pupils to see art techniques modelled by experts, to ensure the delivery of Art is of the highest quality. Each unit of lessons includes multiple teacher videos to develop subject knowledge

and support ongoing CPD.

#### **Our Impact**

Little Bollington's curriculum is designed in such a way that children are involved in evaluation, dialogue and decision making about the quality of their outcomes and the improvements they need to make. By taking part in our regular discussions and decision-making processes, children will not only know facts and key information about art, but they will be able to talk confidently about their own learning journey, have higher metacognitive skills and have a growing understanding of how to improve.

Outcomes are monitored through both formative and summative assessment opportunities. Each lesson includes guidance to support teachers in assessing pupils against the learning objectives. The children will complete an assessment quiz at eh start and end of the unit to assess learning outcomes this enables teachers to keep records of summative assessments for each child.

We aim for the children at Little Bollington to leave primary school equipped with a range of techniques and the confidence and creativity to form a strong foundation for their Art and design learning at Key Stage 3 and beyond. The expected impact in the Art and design scheme of work is that children will:

- ★ Produce creative work, exploring and recording their ideas and experiences.
- ★ Be proficient in drawing, painting, sculpture and other art, craft and design techniques.
- ★ Evaluate and analyse creative works using subject-specific language.
- ★ Know about great artists and the historical and cultural development of their art.
- ★ Meet the end of key stage expectations outlined in the National curriculum for Art and design
